Objectives of the School

In addition to working towards the successful completion of the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD), TanenbaumCHAT strives for a setting that is designed to promote learning, assist each student to achieve his/her academic potential while

developing a personality that is shaped by Jewish values and that appreciates the worth of every human being. The ideal for which the school stands is that every student should recognize that learning is a life-long exercise, and that both Jewish and General education must be pursued beyond high school.

The school is committed to making the high school years meaningful and pleasant, recognizing, however, that education cannot be attained without hard work and self-discipline. The relationship between students and staff is maintained on a personal level that reflects the faculty's attitude of caring and concern. The students are encouraged to turn to members of the staff for assistance in the resolution of academic or social problems.

In addition to its personal and academic components, the uniqueness of TanenbaumCHAT derives from its Jewish Studies program, through which students are guided in the exploration of their Jewish identity. Through the study of Bible, Rabbinic literature, Jewish history, and Hebrew literature and culture, students are expected to develop:

- an appreciation of Jewish religious and cultural traditions;
- an understanding of Halacha;
- growth in the observance of mitzvot;
- deeper commitment to the moral and ethical values of Judaism;
- literacy in the Hebrew language as the primary means of understanding the Jewish heritage, and for the study of both classical and modern Jewish sources;
- identification with the State of Israel;
- involvement in Jewish communal life.

Beyond formal classroom instruction, the students of TanenbaumCHAT are encouraged to participate in a wide range of activities that include athletics, drama, debating, and various modes of musical and artistic expression. A Student Council functions to coordinate student activities within the school, to convey sentiment and opinion to the administration and faculty, and to interact with the community at large.
